1905 - Mythical State Champions! Outscored opponents 172-16.

1914 - Butler scored 8 TD's against Aledo (76-0). Moline watered their field to slow him down - it worked! He was also a 25 foot long jumper who was in the 1920 Antwerp Olympics.

1916 - Lewis B. Wilson, Sr. on this team.

1918 - Beat East Moline 79-0, didn't play them the next four years.

1920 - First Tri-City Championship since 1905. J. Duncan scored three TD's as the Rocks pounded Moline

1927 - First Tri-City Championship in 7 years.

1928 - Bert Durkee named to Illinois All State Team.

1929 - Football Stadium completed with seating for 12,416.

1930 - October 10th First night game played at Rocky.

1933 - Quad City Champions - Beat Moline on Thanksgiving Day before 7,200 people.

1934 - First time ever Big 9 Champions - First coach to beat Moline two years in a row. Kewanee game played before a record crowd of 8,000

1935 - First year in Northwest Conference.

1937 - New high school building opened.

1941 - Shorty comes to Rocky after 13 successful years at Augustana. Only loss was to an undefeated Davenport team. Ted Grevas who was to be the team physician for over 30 years was on this team.

1942 - First undefeated team since 1920. Undefeated and unscored on, two consecutive years at home in the bowl.

1944 - Mythical State Champions. Rocky's third undefeated team. First team to be undefeated and untied. The WHAM backfield consisted of Whan, Hankins, Anderson, and Montz.

1947 - Quad City + Northwest Conference Champs. Only loss to the Iowa State Champions from Clinton.

1949 - Fourth undefeated team. Joel Collier (who went on to coach the Denver Broncos), Dick Thomas, and Jack Whan are familiar names on this team.

1952 - Rocky's Fifth undefeated team. Dick Allison, Jerry Janecke, and Jack Ellis (who later coached at Northwestern University) led this team.

1953 - Sixth undefeated team. 23 straight wins from 1951-1954.

Outscored opponents 316 to 44.

1956 - First year of the Mississippi Valley Conference. Booker Edgerson set a school rushing record of 916 yards. Booker went on to play for the Buffalo Bills.

1958 - John Hass was an Illinois All State Tackle on this squad

1959 - Ken Bowman, a 1959 All State selection, is the only Rock to play on an NFL Championship team. Ken played for the legendary Green Bay Packers and was coached by Vince Lombardi during their run of three straight NFL Championships.

1960 - Almquist's sixth undefeated team. Rock Island's 7th. Big win of the year was the first game over Iowa City on a catch by Tommy Thomas from Larry Shriver.

1961 - Coach Almquist retires after 21 years with a 133-44-11 record.

1962 - Sophomore Coach, Sonny Franck, moves up to head coach.

1964 - The Rocks put the ball in the air with Wilson throwing. Bream and Crompton did most of the catching.

1967 - Embretson comes to us from Luther.

1968 - Ken Johnson sets a new school rushing record - 1,027 yards.

1969 - Rock's eighth undefeated team. This team was led by Lew Miskowicz who went on to play at Notre Dame.

1976 - Board of Education drops financial support of extra-curricular activities. Fund drive by the Rocky fans raised \$108,000 and the activities were on. Embretson left when funding was withdrawn. Sophomore coach, Hugh Johnson, elevated to head job.

1978 - First Rocky team to qualify for IHSA Playoffs.

1981 - Johnson retires as coach and we hire DeSutter from Alleman.

1982 - Second Rock Island team to qualify for state playoffs.

1983 - DeSutter pink-slipped in school cutbacks. Bill Burrus named to lead the Rocks.

1988 - Mortier comes to us after eight years as an offensive coach at Illinois State.

1991 - Boblett arrives from Geneseo after coaching in the 1990 4A State Championship Game.

1993 - Rocks win Western Big Six Conference for the first time in over a decade. Rocky's third state playoff appearance, defeated in the second round by eventual state champion Belvidere. All-time single season team rushing record is established at 3,148 yards, led by Corey Williams with 1,227 yards, also an individual single season record.

1994 - Second consecutive Western Big Six Conference Title and IHSA Playoff appearance.

1996 - 11 wins take the Rocks to the IHSA Class 5A Final Four. The Final Four finish is the highest state playoff finish in school history. Numerous Rocky and State records are established. Rocky becomes the first school in Illinois history to have three 1,000 yard rushers in the same backfield.

1997 - WOW! The Rocks make it to the IHSA Class 5A State Championship game. A school record 13 wins is established in route to the championship game. Rocks lose the State Championship game to Woodstock in what has to go down in playoff history as the most exciting championship game ever played....35-28.

1998 - Rocks complete their second consecutive undefeated regular season and second consecutive Western Big Six Conference Title in route to an IHSA Final Eight finish. The Rocks are led by All-Staters J.J. Tubbs and Jason Morelock. University of Illinois bound Tubbs establishes the all time Illinois High School State Record for most PAT's (points after touchdown) in a career at 150.

1999 - A fourth consecutive Final Eight or better finish in the IHSA Class 5A Playoffs, along with a third consecutive Western Big Six Title, highlighted 1999. The Rocks were led by three Academic All Staters - Justin Peterson (Knox College), Paul Bergstrand (Western Illinois University) + Bryce Palar (Bradley University).

Austin Wheatley a 1995 Rocky graduate and Iowa Hawkeye is drafted by the NFL - New Orleans Saints.

2000 - The Rocks set a new Western Big Six Conference Record by winning a fourth consecutive WB6 Title. The Rocks are led by Bryan Tyson (Miami of Ohio)

2001 - Third undefeated regular season in the past five seasons. The Rocks break their own WB6 record by winning a fifth consecutive Western Big Six Title. Jason Amble (Millikin) establishes new career tackle record.

2002 - A sixth consecutive WB6 title and IHSA Class 6A Final Four appearance highlight the 2002 Rocks season. The Rocks 2nd round 31 - 26 playoff victory versus Rockford Boylan will go down as one of the best high school games ever played at Almquist Field. Chris Tuttle (Monmouth) leads the Rocks and sets IHSA sack record.

2003 - Rocks win a record seventh consecutive WB6 title. An unusual foe "whooping cough" cost the Rocks a win. Rocks are led by ten seniors who go on to play college football.

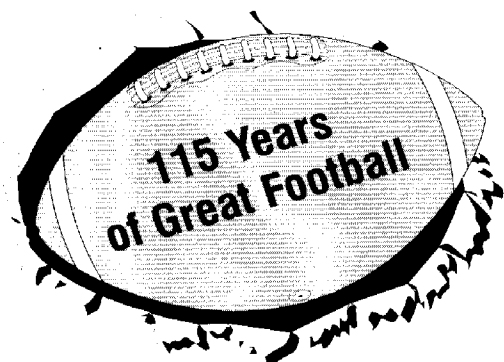
2007 - Rocks finish in the States final eight. Rocks lose to eventual Class 6A State Champion Joliet Catholic in a IHSA Class 6A Quarterfinal matchup.

2008 - Rocks complete only the 12th undefeated regular season in school history. The Rocks also win their 8th Western Big Six Conference title in the past 12 years.

2009 - Rocks win their 9th Western Big Six Conference title in 13 years.

2012 - Rocks win Western Big Six Conference title, their 10th in 14 years.

2013 - Rocks win Back to Back WB6 Title.

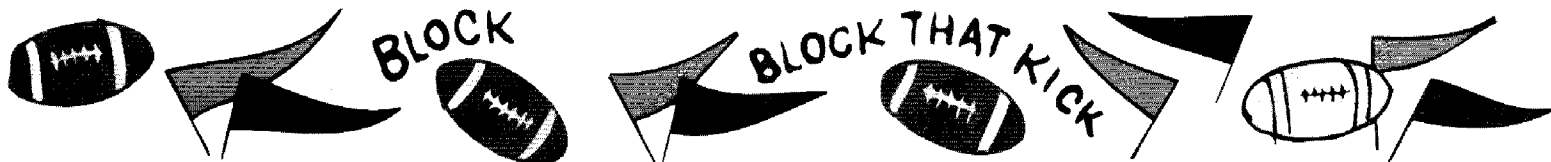
